Have a say on homes

The town council is reminding residents it is important they have a say on plans to build homes in Peacehaven. The next community consultation on Lewes District Council's proposals for the homes will be held at the Meridian Centre on Monday, November 2, between 4.30pm and 7.30pm.

It will be a drop-in surgery for Peacehaven and Telscombe residents. This follows a packed public meeting held in June. Designs will be on display and residents will be able to discuss the proposals individually with district council

officers and architects. The district council says affordable housing is at the heart of its vision to build about 415 homes across the whole of the district.

Seven sites across Peacehaven have been listed as possible land for building flats and houses. Controversially, some of them are car parks off the South Coast Road. The district council is looking through feedback it has already received and will post a selection of comments on its website.

Up the Downs by bike



Rides start from Centenary Park

Autumn wildlife, a visit to a local farm and tips to improve your photography skills are just some of the things you can discover on free bike rides around Peacehaven this month.

Every ride is led by a local expert and routes follow leafy country lanes, bridleways and trails to avoid as much traffic as possible.

All the rides start from Centenary Park off Piddinghoe Avenue, take between one and two and a half hours and, with easy and moderate levels, there will be something for all ages and abilities.

People without bikes can book one in advance for just £5. And for those who do, a bike doctor will be on hand before the ride to check bikes and give advice on minor repairs.

The Peacehaven Discovery Rides are part of a series of events being organised across the South Downs this autumn to encourage more people to explore the National Park by bike.

Rumble with kings of the ring

Grappling fans are getting ready to rumble again when big-time wrestling returns to the Meridian Centre in October.

Since the first event was staged in 2013, the shows in aid of the Mayor's charity fund have become established as some of the most popular attractions in Peacehaven and top promoter Premier Promotions is again planning to pull out all the stops for the Saturday night spectacular on October 24.

The programme will include tag team and solo bouts and the climax will be an all-in rumble in which the wrestlers can be eliminated only by being thrown out of the ring over the top rope. The last man standing will be the winner.

Among the stars battling it out for the king of the ring title will be international grappler "The Polish Eagle" Wolf Alexander, who has

emerged as one of the superstar performers in British rings since making his debut in the Premier Wrestling Federation three years ago. Fans never quite know what to expect when the mercurial Alexander climbs into the ring but they are guaranteed a 100 per cent

display and a powerful rendition of the Polish national anthem.

It will be the Eagle's first Peacehaven appearance after he was forced to pull out of his intended debut bout in February because of injury.

More international stars are being lined up to appear on the show. Among the home challengers in the frame are Meridian favourite Charlie Checkmate, one of the most popular wrestlers on the PWF books, and "Dazzling" Darrell Allen, winner of the rumble in the inaugural Peacehaven show.
